Chattanooga Celebrates 175 Years With Historic St. Elmo Missionary Baptist Church Special Tribute

Thursday, November 13, 2014

Celebrate Chattanooga, "Chattanooga's Celebration Station" hosted by Tekelia Kelly, will present its Special Tribute program on Saturday, online at www.celebratechattanooga.com.

The event is in celebration of Chattanooga's 175th Anniversary and will include a broadcast of music, singing, inspirations, media presentations and more. Featured on program are Pastor Billy Church, Minister of Music Lyndon Carriger, Choir Director Dorothea Johnson, The Historic St. Elmo Missionary Baptist Church Choir, and special guest, gospel jazz guitarist and recording artist Roland Gresham. Tekelia Kelly, Education Technology Consultant and Sisters In Business.Net business owner, will also narrate the event. The event culminates a week-long schedule of activities at Celebrate Chattanooga, which also served as one of the many CHA175.org's community-sourcing events held throughout the city Nov. 1-15.



Founded in 1861, St. Elmo Missionary Baptist was established by loving and faithful people who built on and practiced God's Word--the Bible, love, missions, and service. The church was originally located and served in the St. Elmo community, where its members also resided. The church relocated less than a mile away to its second location on 37th Street. From there the church built its current structure, which is across the street on West Avenue. The church has served St. Elmo, Alton Park, and the Chattanooga community at-large through its various outreach ministries.

Now in its 153rd year, the body rejoices to see another year, and having the opportunity to continue serving Chattanooga. In observance of the church's anniversary, Pastor Billy Church shared with his congregation: "As St. Elmo Missionary Baptist Church family approaches this Holy Celebration, we should remember the words of the Apostle Paul to the Church of Corinth. He said "but thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ. Therefore, my beloved brethren, be ye steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, knowing that your labor is not in vain in the Lord" 1 Corinthians 15:57-58.

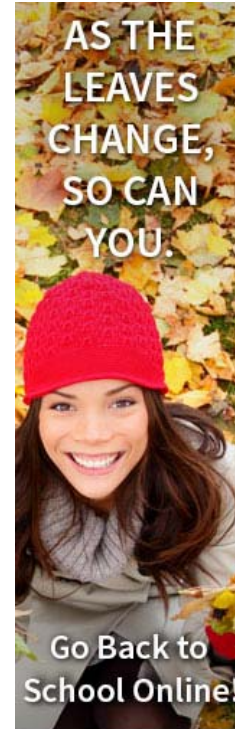

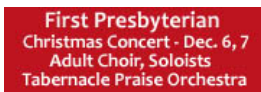

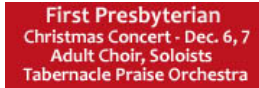
